- Assess, plan, implement and evaluate treatment programs for a variety of patients including orthopedic, medical, neurological, and surgical
- Participate in the discharge planning of clients and liaise with community resources
- Lead the Assess & Restore program – a LHIN funded short-term rehabilitative program targeting frail, high-risk seniors and others with restorative potential that require a level of care that is only available in a hospital bed or LTC home.
- Assess and prescribe assistive devices and equipment
- Maintain records in accordance with OT Standards of Practice
- Provide clinical support/direction to rehabilitation assistants and support staff
